Choose your classroom routines carefully

Routines are so important in the classroom.

How will you achieve an orderly arrival to your lesson? eg.

Will the group line up quietly outside?

Where are school bags stored?

Will they enter your room and stand behind their seat?

Will they simply sit down promptly?

How will you organise resources for the lesson? eg.

Will pupils gather their own books and equipment?

Will you use monitors to distribute and collect equipment?

Do the pupils know how to conduct themselves in your lesson? eg.

Do they ask permission to leave their seat during lessons?

Do pupils have to put hands up to ask or answer a question?

How will homework be collected in?

Will pupils contribute towards classroom displays?

How will rewards be distributed?

How will consequences be monitored?

How will all apparatus, books and equipment be tidied away? eg.

Will all pupils be expected to tidy away?

Will there be a specific team of helpers?

How will the group leave your class room? eg.

Will the quietest table leave first?

Will you dismiss the pupils, row by row, table by table?

Will pupils be dismissed on a given signal or school bell?
